PREPARING FOR YOUR VISIT

Nightfall is an outdoor event designed to go ahead in most weathers.

Make sure you wrap up warm and wear sensible shoes – we advise wellies, waterproofs, walking boots and lots of layers!

The route around #Nightfall23 is well lit, but feel free to bring a handheld torch. Please keep to the paths around the route and look out for signs for artworks that are interactive and can be touched.

Please do not arrive earlier than 10 minutes prior to your start time.

Please have your Nightfall ticket confirmation and main car park/park & walk confirmation ready for inspection – you will need them to park and also to gain entrance to #Nightfall23. Your ticket/parking confirmation can be shown on your phone or printed.

Please note that the main car park and park & walk will be very busy and there isn't capacity to book parking on slots that are full. Unfortunately, we are not able to manage last-minute parking requests.

BOUNCING IDEAS

From left to right, up or down, thoughts can go in any direction. They can bounce inside your mind or go from one to the other. Bouncing Ideas is an ode to imagination and the constant flow of ideas. Being able to visualize ideas and make new connections makes us human. We can imagine, get surprised and adapt, just like the dots of light jumping around, ideas can be

surprising. They bounce off objects, manoeuvre through space and create new perspectives.

Toer is a multidisciplinary design studio from the Netherlands. Their creations start with the freedom of play and are characterized by a strong exploratory and experimental approach.

FIREFLY FIELD

What is the collective noun for a group of fireflies? A swarm seems a little alarming. A twinkle? Or maybe a shimmer? Our favourite is a sparkle of fireflies – what's yours? Firefly Field is a captivating light installation that mimics the movements of nocturnal fireflies, glowing, darting and hovering above the ground. Each firefly has unpredictable and natural movements, creating a mesmerizing and dynamic light scene that triggers curiosity and awe. Firefly Field provides a magical start to Nightfall - a host of glowing fireflies welcoming you to the trail!



The beauty of a summer garden is brought to life at night, celebrating the simple pleasure to be found in the natural world. Larger than life flowers sway and dance in the sunlight, butterflies flutter in and out of view and bees fly by, transforming the space into a peaceful garden full of life. The artwork plays with

scale and perspective by putting the viewer amongst towering blooms and transporting them to a summer's day. Film created by Ithica Films, with animation by Visual Lane and soundtrack by Paula McGough.



IF TREES COULD TALK by Designs in Air & Tees Women Poets

Around the park you will notice that some of the trees have acquired eyeballs... approach and you will hear the voices of the trees: a set of seven poems written and recorded by members of Tees Women Poets. The trees tell us how the world is "connected and small", how the roots of trees in Middlesbrough cover the globe, and how we might "plant a future for us all".

The eyeballs were created by Designs in Air - a pioneering inflatable design company who create original inflatable sculptures and spectacular installations that have been featured at many major events and exhibitions around the world.

Tees Women Poets is a group of writers and performers based across the Tees Valley. The poets bringing the voices of trees to life are: Peggy Carl, Ann Cuthbert, Julie Easley, Eithne Longstaff, Kirsten Luckins, Carmen Marcus and Lizzie Lovejoy. Sound recording by Grace Stubbings.



The Nectary invites you to immerse yourself in nature and hear 'the hum of the earth' as you mimic a pollinating insect, visiting six huge glowing flowers handcrafted from recycled materials. Created by Leeds based artist Alison Smith and Dr. Chris Hassall, lecturer in Animal Biology at the University of Leeds, this light and sound installation explores what we can gain from listening to nature, both for our own wellbeing and to develop an understanding of the delicate ecosystems of which we are a part.

The Nectary was developed with funding from Light Night Leeds, the University of Leeds and From the Fields.

Don't give up on future generations. Work together, keep the faith.


One way or another, hazards ahead can be overcome. You can't stop hope.

Expressing themselves creatively with words, patterns and drawings to create the underpainting for Vishal Joshi to unify through his own stylised illustrations and paintings. This is a huge collaboration between over a hundred local people and one artist.

Watch it come to life under ultraviolet lighting at the old Loggia at Stewart's Park for this year's Nightfall Festival.

vibrant colours. Standing at 8m tall, the artwork emulates the ethereal quality and magic of bubbles, appealing to our universal playfulness and childlike wonder. This immersive, light and sound temporary environment invites you to consider the world around you as a space of transience and fragility, like that of a bubble.

Evanescent was inspired during the Covid-19 pandemic, when the world stopped and everything we took for granted started to disappear. Atelier Sisu endeavoured to communicate this feeling of transient beauty, and the need to live in the moment through the idea of the bubble.

You can also find some of Atelier Sisu's beautiful iridescent droplets floating on the water on the large pond.

Fantasy buildings and lyrics that reimagine community, invented, built, and decorated at Whippet Up creative health sessions across the South Tees area.

People's Palaces by Whippet Up is part of 'For the People, By the people' where people come together to create community-built art that stands proudly beside other artwork at festivals and events. Every People's Palace is a labour of love built at Whippet Up's Creative Health workshops across Redcar & Cleveland and Middlesbrough. Some people find Whippet Up when they are feeling a bit low, others are encouraged to come and join by health and social care staff. Working with Whippet Up artists people lose track of time, worries get replaced with deadlines to build, excitement is shared as each building is created, decorated and lit. Every People's Palace is a beacon of hope.

CRYSTAL FLOWERS by Custom Fibre Optics

Crystal flowers is a beautiful fibre optic lighting installation created by 600 individual handmade illuminated flowers which have been crafted from hundreds of recycled plastic bottles. The mixture of translucent and transparent plastics provide subtle glows and reflections, which draw you in and catch your gaze. The twisting winding stems, the petals, stigma and stamen glow with captivating colour-changing light which seem as if they are moving and dancing in the wind. Crystal Flowers reminds us to take our time, be mindful and appreciate the stunning natural world around us and re-connect with nature.

ONCE WE WERE WATER

Once We Were Water is the second work in a series of digital water recreations by award winning art studio idontloveyouanymore. This project acts almost as the imaginings of a distant culture, an age where rivers and waterfalls no longer flow. What do we remember them as? How do we recreate the natural phenomena in a computerised world?

Built using a particle system that is reactive to your presence, Once We Were Water, flows over you like rivers of the past, and springs to vibrant life under your movements. Through play and connection, it leaves you to ponder both what we are gaining and what we are sacrificing in the digital age. Once We Were Water was commissioned by Light Up Lancaster and Quays Culture.

Vines, flowers and creatures take over The Captain Cook Museum as it is reclaimed by nature as a large scale, playful, sensory projection.

Bold and colourful botanical animations dance over the building's surface, taking the audience on a journey into the natural world. You will have the opportunity to play and interact with the projection, controlling insects crawling on the building with your mobile device - simply scan the QR code and your insect will appear

on the museum wall. The bold and colourful animations are inspired by the museum's collection of botanical work by Joseph Banks from Captain Cook's Endeavour voyage that circumnavigated the globe from 1768 to 1771.

THE WORLD HAS GONE PEAR SHAPED by Studio Tine Bech

This large-scale pear-shaped planet provokes us to think. It is a playful take on the dystopias of our time - it asks where are we now, what have we done to the earth and what possible futures do we want to create? We've all seen images of devastated forests and empty lakes and rivers. Perhaps we've become immune to them. Imagine, instead, that our actions had changed the physical shape of the globe. What we do now matters for the future. Can we change our relationship with our planet and get it back into shape?

See the ponds transformed by light with this beautiful artwork which will hover above the water, reflecting patterns on the water's surface and creating a magical environment full of stars.

A Nova is a transient astronomical event which causes a star to quickly increase the strength of the light it emits. This dramatic process takes place when a star reignites after lying dormant for many years. The Nova artwork is based on the mythical Star of the East which astronomers now believe was actually a nova. As a spectator, you will feel like you are experiencing a nova, or 'new' star – mighty and dazzling. The artwork is a bold sculptural form, a visually complex lantern that also comes to life with smoke effects.





IN A CITY OF FLOWERS by Lou Chapelle

A beautiful holographic and interactive video installation, inviting viewers to gently place their hand within small wooden shelters and hold a butterfly. Each house hosts a different British butterfly - some thriving, some vulnerable or extinct in the UK and some migrating species.

Butterflies are closely linked to plants and some will solely feed on specific species; this artwork is a reminder of how important it is to keep our urban and rural spaces packed with local plants and wildflowers.

LIVING LIGHT

For Nightfall 2023, international artist Amelia Kosminsky has designed a beautiful quiet space away from the hustle and bustle of this cosmic event. Made especially for those who crave a relaxed environment, Living Light, transports the public into a liminal space where the ebb and flow of the natural world creates a mesmerising, tranquil experience.

Living Light is located inside the Captain Cook Museum and will provide a safe, low-level stimulation and recalibration zone for our neurodivergent visitors who may find the festival experience overwhelming. Please note that capacity is limited.

Amelia Kosminsky is an artist whose work focuses on slowing life down to have time to catch the beauty around us. Using elements drawn from nature – wind, water, waves, starlight, moonbeams and phosphorescence – her work captures the slow dreamlike quality of the planet's evolution and the rhythms of the natural world, hoping to reset our frantic overcharged minds. Her work is predominantly peaceful using light to design striking images that contrast with the harshness of urban living.

A carnivalesque sign dazzles with hypnotic colour and the suggestion of pay-per-play enjoyment which seems at odds with its natural setting. The sign toys with familiar fairground iconography and invites audiences to think about the meaning of its presence when removed from its usual environment - is it still as much fun? 'Amusements' is an illuminated text work born from a collaboration between Stuart Langley and Dave O'Donnell.

Stuart's output includes light art, interactive installations and public sculpture. He plays with light, colour and form to offer audiences otherworldly experiences set amongst everyday environments, materials and objects. Motivated to ignite sensations of awe and magic associated with the naivety of childhood, his work is dressed with fantastical utopian ideals as an antidote to the anxiety inducing nature of our days.


Please note our music programme will be different each evening, with different performers and bands each night.
